
In our inaugural year at Brighton, we faced many challenges, and also made many memories together. Students, Teachers, Staff and Parents joined together to make something truly remarkable.

From the early months, when students and teachers were still getting to know each other, to the early months of 2020, great changes occurred. We all grew together.


This Yearbook provides snapshots in time, showing some of the most marvelous, zany and creative activities and events that were so important to all of us.





Secondary students had some fun in the sun, splishing and splashing in the clear blue waters.





Curiosity and wonder were inspired on our first Science Day. Our future pioneers and innovators rolled up the sleeves of their lab coats and went to work!



Secondary students took a bird's eye view and got some perspective on where they live in this big city from the top of a landmark building.




Term One of a new academic year rolled around faster than we thought it would. Time flies when you are having fun, as they say!

Parents and students mixed, mingled and talked to our faculty and administrators about what to expect as BISians.




STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE COUNCIL (SRC) *Election Day* Term 1, Year 2019-2020



ROBOTICS DAY


Everyone knows what a robot is, but not many know what it takes to create them. This was fun event that allowed students to learn about technology and engineering, and to put their ideas to work.
